NHA's Campaign



Research & Development – Federal Dollar Support!

- Obtained \$10 million for DOE FY 08
- Requesting \$54 million for FY 09
- DOE issued solicitation in April 08 (CFDA 81.087)
 - 3 part program
 - June 16 deadline
 - Conventional requires 50/50 cost share and industry partnership
 - Focus on proving technology for new technology and efficiencies for conventional hydropower
 - Develops program for testing centers



Public Affairs Activities

Promoting hydropower as clean energy solution & as a renewable

- Reporter outreach
- Promoting hydro at conferences
- Highlighting hydro's integration benefit
- Working on reservoir emissions and climate change benefit (CO2 avoidance)
