The National Hydropower Association (NHA) and The Hydropower Reform Coalition (HRC) write to express our joint support for a robust and well-funded U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Waterpower program that supports research and development to improve *all* waterpower technologies, including conventional hydropower, pumped storage, and marine and hydrokinetic energy, such as ocean wave and tidal power.

We applaud the work of your Committees to increase funding for initiatives that improve the efficiency, performance, and ecological sustainability of hydropower, and we ask you to remain supportive of a balanced DOE Waterpower program that can be used to improve all hydropower technologies, conventional and non-conventional alike.
